Online learning: do's and don'ts

Please find below some examples of behaviour we'd like to encourage as well as examples of behaviour we'd like to discourage while online learning continues.

Do:

• Respect the GIS behaviour policy, including the dress code, throughout the school day. Remember you may have a video meeting with a teacher and/or fellow students.

- When participating in a video call, ensure there are no disruptions and others in your household are appropriately dressed.
- Contact your teacher if you come across content that is harmful in resources or programmes used in online learning.
- Report any inappropriate behaviour to the teacher.

Don't:

- Wear clothes that are inappropriate within the face-to-face school context.
- Accept invitations or connections from anyone outside the GIS online learning community.
- Lie in bed when you record videos/participate in video calls with fellow students and/or teachers.
- Eat during online meetings with your teachers.
- Share login details of the learning platforms that we use with anyone, including fellow students at GIS.
