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PERSONAL PROJECT 2021

Each IB Programme incorporates a culminating, self- study in which the student explores a topic of interest to themselves, in depth, and reflects on their journey as a learner in the IB programme.

Some parents may already be familiar with the **PYP Exhibition**. The equivalent study for our older students is the **MYP Personal Project.** Personal Projects, as the name suggests, cover a topic of personal interest to the students themselves. These are truly big projects, and the entire process takes about 10 months. Essentially, students are required to manage their 'own, personal MYP subject' over nearly a year!

This year, Grade 10 GIS students completed their Personal Projects in March, and their written reports, photographs, journal extracts and moderated teacher evaluation reports will be submitted to the IB for external evaluation (also called, e-assessment) this week. We anticipate learning the outcomes during summer, an MYP Record of Achievement from the IB.

This Grade 10 demonstrated agency and growth in self-management skills through their implementation of a truly diverse range of concepts and by the depth of their final, reflection on the process.
