
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
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
Parent satisfaction survey: thank you for participating!

PYP responses










- Q2: Report cards give me a good overview of my child's learning.

Grade 9 students start their personal project; information evening for parents.

Grade 9 students have started work on their personal project. The personal project is a chance for students to explore an area that interests them and work to create a product based on that interest. It builds on the skills developed over the last 3 years in the MYP, acting as a showcase for the students to demonstrate not only what they have learnt, but also their own self-management and determination in creating a wonderful product and producing a report that details their learning journey.

Students in Grade 9 have started to think about their projects and are identifying their learning goals and what they would wish to create. They will display their plans for the school to see on 7 June. We are hoping that they will find inspiration from the excellent personal projects they have seen the Grade 10 class produce, both this year and last.

As part of the personal project, each student is assigned a mentor to provide support and feedback during the process. Students have had a chance to express their choice of mentor, and will meet with them to finalise their plans on 17 May. This year the personal project is being organised by the new co-ordinator, Mr Barnaby Davis.

The personal project will be a major part of Grade 9 students' lives over the next 9 months. As such, we would like to invite all parents of Grade 9 students to attend an information sharing meeting on 6 May with Barnaby Davis. This meeting will outline the make-up of the personal project, how the students are supported in their journey, and the key dates of the process. A Zoom link will be sent to parents prior to that date.
