PYP Student-led Portfolio Conferences

"Student-led portfolio conferences are a time to showcase evidence of learning and to celebrate "an active mind at work."

It is nearly time for our Student-Led Portfolio Conferences.

On Tuesday, April 5 you are invited to attend your child's Student-Led Portfolio Conference, during which they will lead you through a celebration of growth, achievement and the learning process.

Working in combination with parent-teacher conferences and report cards, student-lead portfolio conferences place the student in the driving seat. We teachers take a back seat this time, and act as facilitators. We assist in defining the format of the conferences and help prepare students to be successful. As partners in our child's learning and development, student-led conferences will give you a wonderful opportunity to stop, and really hear who your child is at school, and who they want to be.

Student-selected examples of learning, shared via SeeSaw, traditional formats and "stations" are all tools to facilitate your discussions. They will, for example, provide opportunities to:

- read stories and review other forms of writing together
- engage in role-play
- share and review strategies in mathematics
- build models together
- conduct experiments
- discuss unit concepts

Evidence of learning will include plans, drafts and end products as stages of the learning journey. Although conferences will differ somewhat, as teachers and students have co-constructed their own formats in different classes, common to all will be a sense of agency, ownership and self-efficacy on the part of the learner. As facilitators, teachers may have recommended, but not dictated, at least a part of the conversation. All subject areas will be represented.

Our Student-Led Portfolio Conferences take this form because at GIS, we support students in developing as self-assessors and towards being self-regulating and self-adjusting learners who know how to ask good questions of themselves. They learn how to set effective goals and pursue their aspirations with the determination to achieve them. In preparing for and leading the conferences, our students will develop their Approaches to Learning, particularly self-management and communication skills. They embrace their agency, and nurture self-efficacy towards continuous progress as life-long learners.

Your child will tell you what they're proud of, and what they want to learn about. This is not always a conversation that occurs naturally in the home. Make the most of the time they're taking to open up to you. Your role is to respond with interest, kindness and encouragement, and to enjoy this partnership.

We look forward to seeing you on April 5th.

MYP Parent-teacher Conferences

MYP parent-teacher conferences will take place on 5 and 6 April.

MYP teachers are available by appointment from 1:00pm to 3:00pm on 5 April and from 3:30pm to 6:00pm on 6 April. The parents of the remaining students are not required to attend conferences. However, they can sign up for selected conferences using our online booking system, which will open on 1 April and close on 4 April.

Prior to this, parents will receive a checklist for each student. Each teacher will have assessed the student on a set of criteria, including overall achievement, participation in class activities, ability to follow instructions, etc.
